

"I'm gonna be releasing some more music soon. I actually recorded three songs recently." For Trevor, making music is not as simple as writing songs. "I'd say that the hardest thing is having enough money to do the things that I need to do. Like, I need to record and stuff like that. And I need to have money to travel to tour, and I don't quite have that money to do that..." Trevor is working on getting a publishing deal to help him record music and a manager to help him work through the stages of music-making. "Time and money - the things I'm lacking. And it makes it hard to have enough time to do things and enough money to pay for the things I need to do." He's planning on releasing his new music in the next couple of months.

After hearing amazing songs like Into My Arms from his first EP, I'm looking forward to his new music just as much as he is, "I'm looking forward to this publishing deal. So that I can get my better, more current, more pop, more relatable stuff out."

"[My favorite part about writing music is] getting to perform it. Recording it's fun but I love just playing in front of a crowd. Doesn't beat anything. That's what I love about music; it's the live aspect."

Closing our talk, Trevor let me in on his goals for the remainder of the year, "I just want to get my stuff out there and play bigger shows and tour. What would be really cool is I'd like to finish this EP, and get some more singles out, like, more original stuff. And then, find a bigger artist and tour with them. I think it'd be, like, an effective way to build more fans. Like, that's what, um, a lot of artists do, they open up for bigger acts starting out. I should start doing that."



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
